A Day For Dad

The very first celebration of Father's Day was on June 19, 1910, at a YMCA in Spokane, Washington. Sonora Smart Dodd had watched her father single-handedly raise six children. After hearing a sermon about the virtues of Mother's Day, Dodd approached her pastor and suggested a comparable holiday for fathers. Her pastor agreed and set the date for the third Sunday in June.

Father's Day became an annual observance in Spokane, but once Dodd left home to attend school at the Art Institute of Chicago, the holiday was quickly forgotten. Upon her return to Spokane, Dodd embarked upon a crusade to recognize Father's Day on a national level. She sought the help of trade groups that would benefit from such a holiday: tie and tobacco pipe manufacturers. The New York Associated Men's Wear Retailers group even founded a Father's Day Council to promote the holiday. Decades passed, and members of the U.S. Congress resisted founding a national holiday. It wasn't until 1972 that President Richard Nixon made Father's Day a permanent national holiday by signing it into law.

On Eagle's Wings

On June 20, 1782, a picture of a bald eagle with wings who live by sharping and robbing, he is generally Great Seal of the United States. Not everyone accepted the bald eagle as the national bird, and a debate raged for years after its selection. Benjamin Franklin famously objected:

"I wish the bald eagle had not been chosen as the representative of our country; he is a bird of bad moral character; like those among men

outstretched was proposed to the U.S. Congress as the poor, and often very lousy. The turkey is a much more respectable bird and withal a true, original native of America."

> Franklin's objections would be overruled, and in 1787, the eagle was officially adopted as America's national emblem. America was not the first country to use an eagle as its symbol: the ancient Roman Empire and the First Persian Empire both used eagles to denote strength and glory.

Residents received awards and recognition at our awards event held during National Nursing Home Week. Many awards were given to recognize resident involvement in our community, and various contributions they've made.



This hymn is by far one of the most beloved of hymns. It has been recorded by popular singers such as Bing Crosby, Tennessee Ernie Ford, Ella Fitzgerald, and Aretha Franklin, Glen Campbell, and Amy Grant, to name just a few. Taking a look all the way back to who wrote the comforting words to this song, you will find that a preacher named Joseph M. Scriven wrote this as a poem in 1855 to comfort his mother who was ill and living in Ireland while he was living in Canada. Scriven was originally from Ireland and had a good life including wealth, education, and a devoted family. On the night before his wedding his fiancé drowned. Soon after this tragedy, Scriven decided to drastically change his lifestyle, move to Canada, and devote his life to generosity and friendship. He became known as "the Good Samaritan."

A friend of Scriven's found a copy of this poem/ song at Scriven's house and asked who wrote those beautiful words, Scriven responded by saying, "The Lord and I did it between us." None of us ever know what life will bring. Many of us look back on our life and can honestly say that we've survived some really tough times. Perhaps you are currently facing some big challenges. We know our world certainly is! Take heart in the words of this song and rejoice in the certainty that you are not alone. You have a friend in Jesus!
